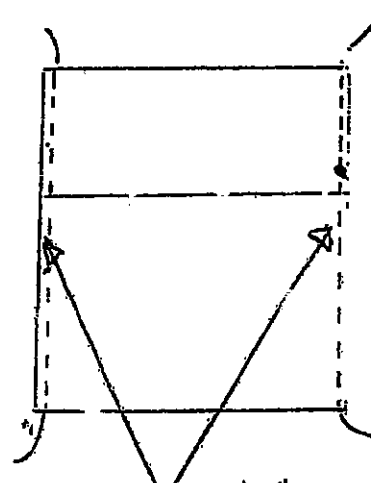
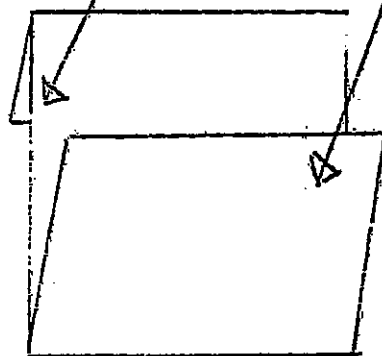


Get a piece of fabric 1 metre long, and 45cms wide. It is best to use a sturdy fabric, and one that doesn't have an obvious right or wrong side works best.

Neaten the edges at each end.

Fold down 15 cm to form the pocket that will hang over the chair back.

Fold up 30 cm on the opposite side to form the pocket for the belongings. Be careful not to overlap the two pockets, as this will make it tricky to turn the seams to the inside. Stitch down.



Turn in the other way, and stitch along the side seam to strengthen it.



Some children and parents work together to decorate and personalise the chairbag, but that is up to you!
